Research

Children will use Google maps to help with this and create a range of charts to represent the data.

Respect

The word 'respect' comes from two Latin words: 're' meaning 'back' and 'specere', meaning 'to look'. So the meaning of our modern word seems to have developed from an idea of looking back at, regarding, or considering someone or something. Today, the word means 'to value someone highly for what they say or do' or 'to treat people politely and thoughtfully, to show we value them'.

Golden and Silver rules

‘Golden Rule’ of treating others as we would like to be treated and it is found as a common theme across all religions.

Some use a different phrase which is ...

‘Don’t do to others what you don’t want done to you’
This is known as the silver rule.

Key Vocabulary

Community: The people living in one particular area or people who are considered as a unit because of their common interests, social group or nationality.

Respect: Admiration felt or shown for someone or something that you believe has good ideas or qualities.

Tolerance: Willingness to accept behaviour and beliefs that are different from your own although you might not agree with or approve of them.

Elders: An older person, especially one with a respected position in society.

Equality: The right of different groups of people to have a similar social position and receive the same treatment.
