

Everyone Grows at Ardleigh Green Schools and we are proud ourselves on the status we place PE and personal development within our inclusive curriculum. We continually look at ways we can improve our physical activity offer to enable all children to achieve 60 active minutes per day. The Sports Premium fund enables us to provide additional opportunities for all children to support in an active lifestyle and enjoyment of physical activity whilst catering for all interests. We also strive to promote new activities and sports as well as active travel. We plan our PE offer around the 5 Key Indicators and assess the impact through pupil voice surveys, data analysis and formative assessment of our PE curriculum.

Our sports premium allocation is based around satisfying the DfE's key indicators. This ensures we direct the funding towards impactful and sustainable initiatives which benefit all children in the school and achieve the key indicators.
